Year 2014, has been started with loads of enthusiastic activities and induction of young volunteers in the organization mostly belonging to rural areas of Kashmir valley. The parameters were to emphasize more on District coordinators in order to work closely and monitor the activities implemented by the organization.

Main agenda of 2014 was to induce more and more women in livelihood and empowerment training apart from their daily household works especially trained them in skill earning trade like Carpet weaving, Shawls Weaving and Self Help Group activities mainly crafted in agriculture and its allied activity.

The main activity of 2014 was to kick start technical education for women with a motto “Computer Must, Women First”, a first of its kind computer literacy centre in Budgam district especially courses designed for women and girls belonging to rural areas.
