1. WOMEN & ADOLESCENT DEVELOPMENT & EMPOWERMENT

However, Gender disparity manifests itself in various forms in Indian society, starting from declining female ratio in the population to violence against women at the domestic and societal levels. The fundamental causes of gender inequality are related to social and economic structure. As a result, access of women, particularly those belonging to weaker sections, to education, health and productive resources, among others, is inadequate. Therefore, they remain largely marginalized, poor and socially excluded.

Dantan Manav Kalyan Kendra puts a special emphasis on development and empowerment of women so that they become able to exercise full control over their own actions. DMKK wants to create an environment where women would have the equal access in participation and decision making. Keeping these in mind, DMKK has organized a series of programmes for social, psychological and economic empowerment of women.

Women SHG Project:

Rural Development Consortium, Kolkata has started a programme named WSHG in PaschimMedinipur district, DMKK as a partner of RDC, Kolkata has been working under the project. A special emphasis has been given in credit linkage of those SHGs which are formed under the programme on behalf of NABARD & Reserve Bank of India. It was observed by NABARD that a large number of SHGs are not given loan in due time. Some bankers has signed a MoU with RDC, one conditions of the MoU is to provide Cash Credit loan to SHGs formed under WSHG programme after 6 months of its account opening. DMKK engaged some animators for group formation, account opening and hand holding support to SHGs. The block wise distribution of groups is as follows:

Other SHGs:

Besides the SHGs under women Self Help Group Programmes, DMKK has promoted 100 SHGs under Self Help Promotional Institute (SHPI) programme assisted by NABARD. Block wise distribution of the 100 SHGs as follows:

After formation, DMKK also conducted various capacity building and skill development trainings for the members of the SHGs. The emphasis is on regular small saving by the members of poor families and its use to solve their immediate problems of consumption and production. The fund created through thrift collection not only helps to meet their most urgent needs, but also trains them to handle larger financial resources in a more wise and effective manner.

However, one of the major obstacles in further development of the programme is non-cooperation and procrastination of Banks for opening of bank account and sanctioning loans to SHGs. In addition the amount of loan is also too meager in comparison to their needs.

Skill Development Training for Women:

Swawlamban Project:

Swawlamban Scheme is being implemented by the Department of Women and Child Development, Govt. of West Bengal. Its basic objective is to provide training and skills to women to facilitate them obtain employment or self-employment on a sustained basis. The target group under the scheme is the poor and needy women, women from weaker sections of the society, such as Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, etc. DMKK in collaboration with West Bengal women Development Undertaking started training programmes on two trades i.e. Bamboo & Wood Craft, Readymade Garments making. Readymade Garments making training at Mohonpur block and Bamboo & Wood Craft training at Dantan-I block. 30 women were selected in each centre. The training programme started in the month of January 2016. 4 months duration training programme from January 2016 to May 2016. Trainees were given stipend Rs 200/- per month per trainee.

Skill Training on Poultry & Duckery for SHG members:

DMKK in collaboration with West Bengal Swarojgar Corporation Ltd. conducted twenty training programmes in Dantan-I block, Dantan-II block, Keshiary block & Narayanganj block in Paschim Medinipur district. 30 women were imparted training in each center. Total 600 women from different SHGs were given training. Each training programme was continuing for 20 days. Block Livestock Development officers along with VS of the concerned blocks attended the training and they took session also. Trainees of the Poultry & Duckery training have started micro entrepreneurship after the training. Income of the trainees is now on average Rs 1600/- per month per head.

Micro Enterprise Development Programme (MEDP):

DMKK in collaboration with NABARD conducted 18 nos training programme. 10 nos training programme on Poultry & Duckery and 8 nos training programme on Dairy & Goatery. Each training continued for 3 days. 30 women from different matured SHGs took part in the training programme. Total 540 women were imparted training. It was an initiative to motivate women to start Micro Enterprise. 87% women started micro enterprise after completion the training programme.

2. YOUTH DEVELOPMENT& IMPORTANT DAYS OBSERVATIONS

Children's Day Celebration:

DMKK celebrated Children's day at Bogda Railway Station in collaboration with GRP, Kharagpur police station. Street children were given Bhai Phonta and new clothes. To give honour to the street children it was one of the endeavors of Dantan Manav Kalyan Kendra. I/C Kharagpur GRP Police Station remain present in the programme. Some other police personnel of Kharagpur police station remain present in the programme. Sweets and tiffin packets were distributed among the children after the programme.

Mentoring support to youth clubs:

DMKK provides mentoring support to youth clubs. There are 16 youth clubs under mentor youth club. Mentoring support is like Registration, renewal, liaison with various departments of Govt. One bi-monthly meeting is conducted for the monitoring the youth clubs. DMKK also conducts different types of programme as directed by Nehru Yuva Kendra, Paschim Medinipur.

3. HEALTH PROJECT

Eye Camp & Cataract Operation:

Dantan Manav Kalyan Kendra in collaboration with Rotary Eye Hospital, Midnapur conducted 6 eye camps in different places under Dantan-I, dantan-II block. Eyes of 568 persons have been checked and 139 people have been selected for cataract operation. Cataract operations were done at Rotary Eye hospital, Midnapur. All the operations were done free of cost. After successful operation spectacles and medicine were given to the patients.

Quilt Distribution among TB Patients:

DMKK in collaboration with Church's Auxiliary for Social Action (CASA) distributed quilts among 104 TB patients under Dantan-I block area. 104 patients were invited in a programme held at Dantan Block Primary Health Centre (BPHC). The programme was attended by Block Medical Officer of Health (BMOH), Medical Officers, ANMs, 2nd ANMs, ASHA workers, Karmadhakshya-Janasthaya O Paribesh Stahyee Samity, Dantan-I Panchayat Samity. We tried to motivate the TB patients to continue their medicine without interruption.

Blood Group testing camp:

Jamua Board Primary School celebrated its 75 years in this year. Head Master of Jamua Board Primary School requested us to assist them in implementation of different social programmes. On behalf of Dantan Manav Kalyan Kendra we provided chemical, equipment and manpower for blood group testing. Blood Group testing of 225 persons were done. 225 person comprises of school student & general people.

HIV/AIDS Awareness Camp:

DMKK conducted a HIV/AIDS awareness programme at village Bejda. A person has been detected as HIV+ along with TB. A social crisis was created. We have been informed about the situation. Villagers of Bejda village convened a meeting in consultation with us. The meeting was convened at Bejda Primary School. We requested block Medical Officer of Health, Dantan BPHC and Dy CMOH-II to attend the awareness programme. Dy CMOH-II addressed the participants and discussed about HIV and TB. After the programme we visited

the house of HIV+ people and helped his family live normal life and also requested local people not to ignore that family.

HIV/AIDS Awareness Camp:

DMKK has been entrusted to run Rogi sahayata Kendra at Dantan BPHC. 2 Personnel were engaged at the centre. They have been provided a space and computers to facilitate patients as well as the relatives of patient parties while they come to hospital. 2 personnel engaged by DMKK, work under the supervision of BMOH of Dantan BPHC.

Referral service:

DMKK gives referral services to those people who approach to DMKK for getting advice regarding health services. Workers of DMKK advise the patient parties where to go and how to go for getting right treatment.

4. WORKSHOP, SEMINAR, FAIR & AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Consumer Awareness Camp:

DMKK in collaboration with the office of Consumer Affairs & Fair Business Practices conducted several awareness programmes at community level and village level round the year. People, particularly the poor are cheated by dishonest traders. When already, the people are facing high price rice for all items including food items, cheating by traders are further deteriorating socio-economic conditions of the poor. DMKK had taken an initial step to aware people on different aspects of consumer protections. Detail of such camps organized in the FY is furnished below:

Financial Literacy Awareness Programme:

DMKK in collaboration with NABARD conducted Financial Literacy Awareness Programme at Alikosha Gram Panchayat under Dantan-I block. District Development Manager, NABARD and managers of nearby bank branches were invited and they also remained present in the programme. DDM, NABARD inaugurated the programme. Welcome address was given by Pradhan, Alikosha Gram Panchayat. Pradhan Mantri Bima Yojana, Jan Dhan Yojana, Atal Pension Yojana were discussed by DDM, NABARD and branch managers. 73 people took part in the awareness programme. Managers promised that they would assist citizens in opening of accounts under the above mentioned programmes.

Awareness Programme on National Trust Act:

Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy assisted DMKK to conduct awareness programme on National Trust Act and four types of disabilities covered under National Trust Act. DMKK conducted meeting at Gram Panchayat Level. There are 9 Gram Panchayats under Dantan-I block. So, 9 awareness programmes were conducted. Before starting the programme, we discussed with Child Development Project Officer (CDPO), Dantan-I ICDS Project and Block Medical Officer of Health (BMOH), Dantan BPHC and we requested them to remain present in the awareness programme and also requested them to issue necessary instruction to the AWWs and ASHA workers to remain present in the awareness programmes. Angan wadi Workers (AWWs), ASHA workers under each Gram Panchayats were invited to take part in the awareness programme. One resource person came from Indian Institute of Cerebral Palsy (IICP), Kolkata to facilitate the programme.

5. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

Dr Asha Das Memorial Library:

In memory of Late Dr. Asha Das, and with the financial help from her sister Mrs. Bina Das, DMKK has been running a rural library at its own premises located at Krishnapur Apart from story books, the library also hosts text books for students. Daily newspaper and monthly magazines are also subscribed. Library remains open from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. every day (except Sunday). On an average 22-25 readers come to library every day. 11 poor and meritorious students were given stipend @ Rs 1000/- each under the library.

Combating Malnutrition & Poverty Project:

Awareness programme for promotion of livelihood through animal husbandry:

Total 3 awareness programmes have been done on the same subject in different project areas of Nayagram Block. 86 people took part in the programme. The project staff and some veterinary Officers took the session and aware the community people. Different vaccination camps have been done after the programme. Now a good liaison has been done to the BLDO Office. We assist 6 tribal groups i.e. 60 women to get the RIR chicks from the Animal Recourse Department, Nayagram Block Livestock Development Office. They are Naldam Baram Chandi SHG, Naldam Baram Thakur SHG, Ambisole Sabar Mahila SHG, Ambisole Lodha Mahila, Bansiasole Prantik SHG, Chiripiti Adibasi SHG.

Capacity Building on hygienic cooking to SHG members engaged with Mid-day meal:

One capacity building programme on hygienic cooking have been done in our targeted villages by the support of CASA. About 36 members of twelve SHGs and 11 AnganWardy Workers & AnganWardy Helpers took part in the programme who are directly involved in Mid-Day Meal cooking and in ICDS centre. Mr. Chandan Patra, Nutrition Teacher of Baligeria SC High School would present to capacitate the participants. The Main subjects covered in the training were Nutrition and process of hygienic cooking. Through this programme we think about 600 students got healthy food from their institutions.

Capacity Building programme of community leaders on veterinary services & Different Programmes of Animal Resource Department:

2 capacity building programmes on veterinary services & Different Programmes of Animal Resource Department have been done among the community leaders. 62 people took part in the programme. Different programmes of ARD have been discussed such as awareness trainings to the group, poultry and goatery distribution to SHGs, pair of bull to the active farmers. Thirty Women got the training on Goatery. Vaccination programmes has been followed.

Capacity Building on Kitchen Garden & Nursery to SHG leaders:

Dantan Manav Kalyan Kendra along with CASA capacitated the SHG leaders on kitchen garden and on Nursery. 265 families are engaged in kitchen garden. Rangiam Sabujsathi Group grew 25000 forest saplings and earn a lot of money through Gram Panchayet.

Community level meeting on land right & forest right:

2 community level meetings have been done on land right & on forest right. We are trying to assist people to get patta. Now they protect their forest in better way. The previous committee has been changed and new forest right Committee has been formed.

Community Level meeting on NSSF, Pension schemes of different departments, Horticulture schemes, Schemes of Forest Dept. & RSBY:

6 community level meetings has been done on NSSF, Pension schemes of different departments, Horticulture schemes, Schemes of Forest Dept. & RSBY and right & on forest right. Through this meetings about 24 community people would be benefited in different Schemes.

Hand Washing Programme in different Schools:

"Prevention is better than cure". Thinking so Dantan Manav Kalyan Kendra and CASA jointly started an activity in all ICDS, SSK and primary school of the targeted area of Nayagram Block for maintain proper hygiene. Proper hand washing before taking food and after toilet is the first and foremost best way to avoid some infectious diseases. So we want to grow the habit of hand washing before taking food and after toilet in those areas through children. And the children can change their parents. We distributed handbill regarding this subject. Children are very interested in this programme. 4 camps have been done during the period.

System of Rice Intensification Report in the targeted villages:

System of Rice Intensification better known as "SRI" which is a very good ultra-modern technique in cultivation is a new process to the villages before our intervention to the villages. After forming Farmers Club we want to implement the new system through the farmers of the villages. We arranged 3 trainings to motivate the farmers. The Volunteer of CASA had come to the field to train the farmers directly. Then we contact with ADA and the problem was solved in the following year. Now about 65 farmers are habituated in the process. And day by day the numbers are increasing. Now they agreed that this is a very low cost process to make good profit. Two demo plots have also prepared.

Malnutrition Detection Camps:

As we are working in the field of malnutrition, we targeted three malnutrition Camps in the seven ICDS centers to identify malnourished children in the field area. We involved the concerned ICDS workers in this programme. We took the measurement of the arm, weight & height. After that according to the growth chart the ICDS workers remarked. This process took the attention of the local people. They show their interest in the activities. Then we liaison with "PARAS" department, a nutrition rehabilitation centre in the Jungle Mahal. Local people are being benefitted through the programme.

Training Programme in Bamboo Craft under NFM:

DMKK in collaboration with District Industries Centre, Paschim Medinipur conducted skill diversification training programme in bamboo craft at Dantan-I block. 40 artisans took part in the training programme. The programme was being continued for 30 days. 4 trainers were engaged to train the trainees. Different types of diversified products were made by artisans. After completion of 30 days training, every trainee was given tool kit. It was expected that trained artisans would utilize the tool kit for the purpose of production of diversified items at their home. Inauguration and valediction programme were attended by GM-DIC, Sahakari Sabhapati, Dantan Panchayat Samity, Karmadhakshyas of Dantan-I Panchayat Samity, Jt BDO-Dantan-I block, Secretary-DMKK.

New Clothes Distribution among Distressed Children before Durga Puja:

New clothes were distributed among the distressed children on the eve of Durga Puja. Clothes were donated by the students of well to-do families. In this year 237 children were given new clothes.

Producer Organisation Promoting Institution (POPI) Project:

DMKK has been selected as Producer Organization Promoting Institution (POPI) by NABARD. Under this programme, DMKK has promoted 7 producer organisations in Paschim Medinipur district. All the producers organisations are farm based. All are trying to develop business plan. On behalf of Dantan Manav Kalyan Kendra proper facilitation is being given in developing business plan and keeping relevant registers and book of accounts.

6. DISABILITY PROJECT

Prosthetic Aids and Appliances distribution:

DMKK in collaboration with National Institute for the Orthopedically Handicapped (NIOH), Kolkata conducted disability evaluation and assessment camp at Dantan-II, Keshiary and

Narayangarh block in Paschim Medinipur district. After the evaluation and assessment camp prosthetic aids and appliances were distributed among the identified disabled persons. Wheel chair, tricycle, crutch, blind sticks were distributed among the disabled persons. 46 at Narayangarh block, 41 persons at Keshiary block get benefit from the camp. DMKK in collaboration with Commissioner of Disabilities distributed Hearing Aid and blind sticks among 24 hearing impaired & visually impaired persons.

Skill Development Training for PwDs:

DMKK in collaboration with National Institute for the Orthopedically Handicapped (NIOH), Kolkata provided skill development training programme for the PwDs. 46 PwDs have been imparted training on Animal Husbandry & Agriculture. There were 9 training centers. 3 training centres at Dantan-I block, 3 training centers at Narayangarh block, 2 training centers at Nayagram block and 1 training centers at Mohonpur block. 5 trainees at each training center except one training center at Nayagram block. 9 experienced trainers were deployed for the purpose of training. 39 trainees started micro enterprise after completion the training. We helped 16 trainee to apply for grant under ERG scheme of Social Welfare Department through District Social Welfare section. All the application are under process.

Niyoti Day Care Centre:

DMKK took an initiative to start a day care centre for Mental Retarded, Autism, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabled persons. We took a list from Inspector of Schools, Dantan circle. We have invited the parents of Mental Retarded, Autism, Cerebral Palsy and Multiple Disabled children. As per norms of National Trust target age group of the day care centre would be 10 years to 18 years. We have discussed the activities of day care center before parents. Hearing the discussion, they felt glad and agreed to send their children to the proposed day care centre.

7. ANIMAL WELFARE PROJECT

Animal Vaccination Programme:

DMKK in collaboration with block livestock development office, Dantan-I & Nayagram organized animal vaccination camps. Domestic animal like cow, buffalo, and goats are generally vaccinated through the camps. In this year 12 such vaccination camps were organized by DMKK. Normally common people are not interested about vaccination of domestic animals. They think that vaccination is required when the particular animal will be fallen sick. Repeated sensitization programme by the workers of DMKK breaks the traditional thoughts of common people. Common people are now very much interested about vaccination because they realized vaccination in due course of time prevents different diseases.

Membership

District Road Safety Committee:
